RE: Update on BC Collective Bargaining: Extending the pause until end of June

As we communicated on March 29th bargaining matters, the Union and Finning had agreed to pause negotiations as a result of COVID-19 and subsequent travel restrictions. It was agreed to re-assess at the end of April and determine next steps. The parties have agreed to extend the pause on negotiations until the end of June.

The reason for the decision:

The safety of all members of the bargaining committees that are located in B.C. and Alberta. As we move forward with the hope that travel restriction and social distancing protocols ease.

The parties have committed to resuming negotiations in early July, either in person or using remote technology. The Union feels that it is important for our committee to be together in person as we move forward in the bargaining process.

As a reminder to everyone that the collective agreement remains in full effect during this pause.
